MINUTES

Stated Annual Meeting of Presbytery de Cristo January 29-30, 2016

CALL TO ORDER

Presbytery de Cristo of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) held its Stated Annual Meeting at First Presbyterian Church in Casa Grande. This was a joint meeting with the Presbytery of Grand Canyon. Moderators Stephanie Hamilton, de Cristo, and Mary Lynn Walters, Grand Canyon, opened the meeting on Friday at 2:00 p.m. with prayer and the lighting of the peace candle.

Commissioners attending for the first time and other guests were welcomed. Corresponding members were introduced and approved for enrollment by the Presbytery for this meeting. Bob Schulz, Stated Clerk/Associate, reported that a quorum was present, consisting of three Teaching Elder members and the Ruling Elder members present, with at least three churches being represented by Ruling Elders.

CONSENT AGENDA

Approved modifications to the MEPF Administrative Commission.

Approved designating the offering at the January 2016 Presbytery meeting for Refugee Ministries in both Presbyteries and, if no other designation is provided by MFL, offerings at future meetings will be dedicated to Triennium scholarships.

2. Ministry for Administration Report

2015 Endowment Fund Report

The beginning balance for the fund, after donating ninety percent of 2014 earnings to MWO, was \$73,009.56. With a rocky investment year, half the fund's investment in the New Covenant Balanced Income Fund was moved to the New Covenant Balanced Growth Fund. The ending balance, as of the close of business December 31, 2015, was \$72,927.59, a loss of \$81.47 for the year. There were no earnings to share with MWO.

New authorities for Presbyterian Campus Ministries are taking over the responsibilities for their investments under the Presbytery's Employer ID number so MFA will no longer have any responsibilities for those funds.

Fred Whitley, Endowment Chair

Actions taken at the November 12, 2015 meeting

Authorized Larry Norrid to notify 5L Properties that Presbytery de Cristo does not plan to adjust the terms of the oil and gas lease.

Approved development of a task force for handling signatory duties surrounding financial investments, with Larry Norrid and Thomas Calhoun to act as signatories, effective January 31, 2016.

Authorized Fred Whitley to reallocate the mix of investments in the Endowment Fund to improve income growth.

Approved the use of \$1,500 in 2051 Youth Funds for Triennium scholarships, thereby closing out that account, and approved creating a new Triennium budget line item so funding can be budgeted on an annual basis.

3. Committee on Ministry Report

Actions taken at the October 1, 2015 meeting

Approved the transfer of membership of the Rev. Thomas Letts (At-Large) from the Presbytery of Yukon to Presbytery de Cristo, effective October 1, 2015.

Hamilton, Stephanie

Approved changing the status of the Rev. Stephanie Hamilton on the Roll of Teaching Elders from Validated Ministry to Member-At-Large, effective October 1, 2015.

Munroe, Laura

Approved revision to the motion made at the September 3 COM meeting to indicate permission for CRE Laura Munroe to administer the Sacraments at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, effective 10/1/15.

First Presbyterian Church, Silver City

Authorized Ruling Elder Barbara Taylor, who received instruction on January 25, 2015, to serve the Lord's Supper at First Presbyterian Church in Silver City, effective June 1, 2015 through March 31, 2016.

Appointed John Cheek to serve as moderator of the Session meeting at First Presbyterian Church in Silver City on October 3, 2015.

The Holy Way Presbyterian Church

Approved a new position at The Holy Way Presbyterian Church to be defined as "Parish Associate" for part-time service (10 hours/week at \$23/hour) under supervision of the Session, effective October 1, 2015, for a six-month trial period, renewable by agreement of the Session, Pastor and Parish Associate. (The Rev. Elizabeth Smith was hired for this position.)

Community Presbyterian Church Coolidge and First Presbyterian Church Florence

Approved and supported an agreement between the Sessions of Community Presbyterian Church in Coolidge and First Presbyterian Church in Florence for the shared pastoral services of TE John Johnson, with the terms of such a Pastoral Agreement to be presented for approval at the November COM meeting.

Review of Sexual Misconduct Prevention Policy

Concluding COM's review of proposed revisions to the current Sexual Misconduct Policy:

Approved the following under Groups Requiring Sexual Misconduct Education and Training:

Persons required to be included in training are: Presbytery staff; Investigating Committees; Committee on Ministry; RCT members; and teaching elders and commissioned ruling elders, ministerial candidates, newly ordained and clergy new to the Presbytery.

Persons recommended to be included in training are: Clerks of Session and other church members serving in ordered ministries; and professional and non-professional church staff.

Persons allowed to be included in training are: local church members.

Approved the entire section under Item #5 as recommended by Hugh Wood/Insurance Board.

Approved wording for inclusion in the Sexual Misconduct Prevention Policy to indicate:

Conviction for the following crimes shall be considered barriers to employment or volunteer work with children: violent crimes; sexual assault; and sexual abuse or neglect of a child.

Drug offenses or driving offenses (depending upon position requirements) shall be reviewed and may be considered barriers to employment or volunteer work with children.

To approve removal of section titled "Grandfathering Not Permitted."

Approved inclusion of the 3 appendices (Limited Access for Cases of Convicted Sex Offenders, Code of Conduct, and Ministry Standards) as Presbytery recommended templates.

Triennial Visits

Approved procedure to include that a COM Triennial visit team will submit a written report to COM which, after review by the Stated Clerk, will be sent to the church Session.

Minimum Salary for 2016

Approved that the Presbytery minimum salary for 2016 remain at \$45,000 for Teaching Elders.

5. Committee on Representation Report of Annual COR Review

The meeting was held on January 7, 2016 at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church. Those attending were Russell Amling, moderator of the Committee on Representation, Brad Munroe and Bob Schultz. As the Committee on Representation, we are charged with maintaining the correct balance on all committees each year. A review was conducted of the slate of those previously elected or being elected to serve on committees for 2016. Our report is as follows:

Ministry for Leadership: Looks as though it is within the correct parameters.

Ministry for Administration: Looks like there are too many RE's and not enough TE's, plus short one member.

Committee on Ministry: Looks good.

Ministry for Witness & Outreach: All is in order for this committee.

Committee on Preparation for Ministry: This committee is out of balance and needs more RE's.

Committee on Representation: Fairly well balanced but needs a little tweaking. There are two vacancies.

Permanent Judicial Commission: Commission well represented.

Ministry for Service (Nominations): The ratio of men and women needs work, along with the ratio of TE's and RE's.

Synod of the Southwest Commissioners: This is balanced with TE's and RE's but needs balance with men and women.

Conclusions: The Ministry for Service (Nominations) has worked many hours to get members to accept being elected to our various committees. I personally want to commend this committee for all their hard work and many hours spent in order to present a slate of committee members. MOTION: To elect TE Paul Phillips as Moderator-Elect of Presbytery de Cristo for 2016.

RE George Prohaska was elected Moderator-Elect of the Presbytery of Grand Canyon.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CORPORATION

The Presbytery meeting was recessed and the Annual Meeting of the Corporation was called to order. The following was approved:

MOTION: To elect the 2016 Presbytery de Cristo Corporation officers:

President RE Linda Freeman
Vice President TE Paul Phillips
Treasurer RE Paul Carey
Secretary RE Robert Schulz

The Annual Meeting of the Corporation was adjourned.

BOARD OF PENSIONS REPORT

Clayton Cobb, Board of Pensions representative to both presbyteries, announced that there would be changes in 2017 to the affiliated program, offering a menu of options rather than the current bundle. The Board hoped to have an online pricing tool on its website prior to the General Assembly meeting.

Clayton reported that more than 40% of Board of Pension participants in both Grand Canyon and de Cristo had completed the 2015 Call To Health, qualifying them for lower health care deductibles for 2016.

PLENARY SESSION 1: A CALL TO THE CHURCH

RE Heath Rada, Moderator of the 221st General Assembly, was welcomed. He spoke about his efforts to have the PC(USA) evaluate the shape and form of its future ministry. In his travels as Moderator he said he had found a concerned, grace-filled spirit desiring a denomination "not called to be the judges, but called to be the Church." He had been convicted that the PC(USA) needed to move now in a new direction. He said that young adults, particularly in urban areas, had expressed an interest in a church which was: 1) open to their asking questions; 2) concentrated on being a church "without walls" and committed to active outreach, and 3) accepting of diversity. Heath reported that the PC(USA) staff was working to plan a 222nd General Assembly that would concentrate on who we are going to be.

Commissioners from both presbyteries were then asked to split into conversation groups of from 10-12 people to discuss what focus they would like to see the denomination take towards a new future. A number of suggestions were offered as each group reported briefly on their discussion. Written details of the discussions were turned in so they could be given to Heath and evaluated and reported back to the presbyteries.

TRIENNIUM UPDATE

Bart Smith and Tully Fletcher encouraged continued enrollment for the Youth Triennium, the largest gathering in our denomination drawing more than 5,000 participants. So far, 15 were signed up from de Cristo and 19 from Grand Canyon.

MONTLURE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH CAMP UPDATE

Montlure Board member Liz Wallendorf reported on the status of the camp, jointly sponsored by de Cristo and Grand Canyon. Obtaining U.S. Forestry Service permission to again use the camp after the damage caused by the 2011 Wallow Fire was not certain due to the possibility of mudslides.

The Board was deciding whether to attempt to raise funds to complete a \$100,000 risk assessment study of the Greer site and was taking time to discern the best way forward in continuing their ministry. Montlure was able to provide camping opportunities the past few summers by renting other facilities, and four camp sessions were planned for 2016 at a camp in Flagstaff.

WORSHIP

There was a time to remember and celebrate the lives of the pastors and church elders from both presbyteries who joined the Church Triumphant during 2015. Ruling Elder Heath Rada delivered the sermon. Heath and the Rev. Harry Cole presided over the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Special music was provided by First Casa Grande's chancel and bell choirs.

The offering on Friday evening and Saturday morning was dedicated to refugee ministries and totaled \$1,588; \$140 was donated for Triennium; and the Cents-ability collection at dinner was \$167.41.

The Moderators for 2016 were installed, RE Linda Freeman for de Cristo and TE Ken Page for Grand Canyon. Hilbert Schouten was commissioned as a Grand Canyon CRE serving VahKi Presbyterian Church in Bapchule. Commissioners to the 222nd General Assembly were commissioned: TE John Cheek (Northminster), RE Robin Thomas (The Holy Way), and YAAD Erin Cech (Christ). Heath Rada officiated at the commissioning for all and gave the charge. Following the benediction, the meeting recessed until Saturday morning.

RECONVENE

The business meeting of Presbytery de Cristo was opened in prayer by Moderator Linda Freeman on Saturday, January 30, 2016, at 8:00 a.m.

APPROVAL OF REVISED BYLAWS

Stated Clerk/Associate Bob Schulz introduced proposed revised Bylaws for approval. The Bylaws revision had been presented for first reading at the August 15, 2015 Presbytery meeting and for second reading at the October 17, 2015 Presbytery meeting. Bob had made minor clarifications to the Bylaws as he received comments or questions. The final proposed version, dated December 30, 2015, had been posted to the Presbytery website prior to this meeting.

The motion (A) to approve the revised Bylaws was made and seconded. This was followed by a motion (B) made and seconded to amend the Bylaws to specify only three groups as commissions, with the others to be specified as committees.

Bob clarified that commissions were given broader power to make decisions and take actions on behalf of the Presbytery, whereas committee decisions/actions required Presbytery approval. This did not preclude requesting more information on a commission's action reported in the Consent Agenda at a Presbytery meeting, just as with a committee's action. Members of a commission must also be either Teaching or Ruling Elders, but committees may include unordained lay persons.

There was another proposed motion (C) amending the above amendment (B) requesting clarification as to the actual number of commissions and identifying them as Leadership Team, COM and the PJC. This motion (C) was seconded and approved. The second motion (B) was approved. The original motion (A), as amended (B&C), was then approved as follows:

MOTION: To approve the proposed Bylaws for Presbytery de Cristo, to be amended to include wording specifying three commissions (Leadership Team, Commission on Ministry and Permanent Judicial Commission) and five committees (Administration, Preparation for Ministry, Mission, Nominating and Representation), with the Stated Clerk charged with making these approved modifications to the Bylaws, effective January 30, 2016.

There was a question about the definition of a quorum in the Bylaws. It was agreed that the Bylaws should clarify that a quorum may not be less than the majority of the commission/committee members, despite the temptation for a commission/committee to stipulate an easier-to-attain quorum in order to conduct business when a number of members are not present. It was noted that business could proceed at a meeting lacking a quorum, with any actions to be ratified at a future meeting at which there was a quorum. Rather than a formal motion on this subject, Bob Schulz was asked to make a clerical clarification(s) regarding the meaning of quorum in the Bylaws wherever appropriate.

APPROVAL OF MANUAL OF OPERATIONS

Stated Clerk/Associate Bob Schulz introduced a proposed revised Manual of Operations for approval. The Manual revision had been presented for first reading at the August 15, 2015 Presbytery meeting and for second reading at the October 17, 2015 Presbytery meeting. Bob had made minor clarifications to the Manual as he received comments or questions. The final proposed version, dated December 30, 2015, had been posted to the Presbytery website prior to this meeting.

The motion (D) to approve the revised Manual of Operations was made and seconded. This was followed by a question as to whether the Leadership Team should be permitted to make decisions or take actions on behalf of Presbytery, based on the opinion that the *Book of Order* mandated that all decisions be approved directly by the Presbytery. There was a motion (E) made and seconded to call the previous question (D). A voice vote on the motion (E) was not definitive and a hand vote was taken, with the motion to call the question upheld by a vote of 24 for and 17 against. The original motion (D) was then approved:

MOTION: To approve the proposed Manual of Operations for Presbytery de Cristo, with an effective date of January 30, 2016.

DISCUSSION OF GRACIOUS DISMISSAL POLICY

There was discussion about the proposed revision to the policy entitled "Commitment To Pursuing Reconciliation with Member Churches Seeking Gracious Dismissal from the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)" which was adopted on October 19, 2013.

Several presbyters noted that it was difficult to determine where changes had been made. Bob Schulz was asked if he could provide a strikeout version. The following was approved:

MOTION: To table consideration of approval of the revised Gracious Dismissal Policy so a version indicating the revisions can be made available.

APPROVAL OF OVERTURE REGARDING CRES

There was discussion of a proposed overture to the General Assembly from Presbytery de Cristo regarding commissioning a Commissioned Ruling Elder (CRE) to more than one church not served by a Teaching Elder or CRE. The Presbytery had been trying this as a way to serve a number of our small congregations, but a disciplinary complaint had been filed with the Synod by a member of the Presbytery seeking to reject this practice as not in accord with the *Book of Order*. There was an approved motion to call the previous question and the following was approved:

MOTION: To approve the proposed Presbytery de Cristo overture to the 222nd General Assembly regarding service of CREs to multiple churches, as follows:

Overture: On amending Section G-2.1001 to make more clear discretion given presbyteries to utilize Commissioned Ruling Elders effectively in fulfilling the presbyteries' missions, especially to smaller congregations.

Presbytery de Cristo respectfully overtures the 222nd General Assembly to send the proposed amendment to the presbyteries for their affirmative or negative vote: Shall G-2.1001 of the Form of Government be amended by adding the language shown in bold to the existing language:

[*G*-2.1001 Functions]

When the presbytery, in consultation with the session or other responsible committee within the presbytery, determines that its strategy for mission requires it, the presbytery may authorize a ruling elder to be commissioned to limited pastoral service as assigned by the presbytery. A ruling elder so designated may be commissioned to serve in a validated ministry of the presbytery. Presbytery, in its commission, may authorize the ruling elder to moderate the session of the congregation to which he or she is commissioned, to administer the Sacraments, and to officiate at marriages where permitted by state law. The commission may be to more than one specified congregation for occasional specified service, when such requests for occasional service originate from the session or its clerk or the pastor. This commission shall also specify the term of service, which shall not exceed three years but shall be renewable. The presbytery shall review the commission at least annually.

APPROVAL OF 2016-17 PRESBYTERY BUDGET

Tommy Calhoun, Moderator of MFA, introduced the proposed budget, which had been distributed with the meeting call materials. (A copy of the budget is included at the conclusion of these minutes.) The following was approved:

MOTION: To approve the proposed February 1, 2016 - January 31, 2017 Presbytery de Cristo Operating Budget.

Jane Raffety, Chair of MWO, explained that the mission budget was underfunded for the coming year due to lack of Presbytery investment income for 2015, a portion of which would normally be designated for the 2016 mission budget. MWO had only heard from 17 of our 29 churches as to 2016 pledges toward missions. MWO was proposing that pledges from churches no longer be designated but instead go into a unified pool from which MWO would determine mission giving to eight mission partners.

COMBINED PRESBYTERY MEETING

The morning began with worship focused on immigrant ministries and highlighted by praise music led by members of the African fellowship worshiping at Orangewood Presbyterian Church in Phoenix. There was also a blessing of the outreach ministry of Estawri Khjeek to Middle Eastern immigrants in the Phoenix area. The Rev. Mary Beth McSwain delivered the sermon. She and the Rev. Ken Page presided over the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

The 2015 Presbytery Moderators, Stephanie Hamilton for de Cristo and Mary Lynn Walters for Grand Canyon, were recognized and thanked for their service.

PLENARY SESSION 2: DISCUSSION ABOUT THE FUTURE OF THE PC(USA)

Bob Schulz had made a preliminary tally of the written comments offered by the conversation groups at the Friday plenary, with a more detailed list to eventually be reported to the presbyteries. One of the key themes was that each presbytery should be more internally relational, with ideas offered such as: pulpit exchanges, collaborative missions, Sessions meeting other Sessions, and shared resources. A desire for open and inclusive conversations, with an ability to agree to disagree, had been expressed.

The top request was for presbytery-sponsored educational opportunities, first and foremost for our youth and/or youth leaders. Training for lay people was wanted in everything from church management to COM and Clerk of Session training. Doing this at combined presbytery events was welcomed.

Heath Rada, Moderator of the 221st General Assembly, said he would add these comments to those he was compiling for GA. He then expressed some concerns he had at the national level, beginning with a decline in focus and funding for global missions and mission coworkers in the field, an area where the PC(USA) was once a recognized world leader. He was happy to report, however, that 300 of the proposed 1001 New Worshipping Communities had been started. He voiced concern for supporting our small congregations of less than 150 members, which make up 80% of PC(USA) churches, voices often lost among those of the remaining 20% of the churches which represent 80% of total PC(USA) members.

Heath reported that in this day of diminishing membership and corresponding shrinking of finances, 108 of the 171 presbyteries no longer had both a Stated Clerk and Executive Presbyter. He regretted what he called a broken system which was more and more focused on handling crises. He wanted to see the denomination moving out of committees and into ministry.

Among the changes Heath wanted to see at the 222nd General Assembly was a provision for a technology consultant for churches. He also hoped to see a move from six GA agencies, each operating as a separate entity, to a more unified structure and cohesive sharing of resources to better serve the denomination.

STATED CLERK REPORT

Bob Schulz gave an overview of the major administrative accomplishments of 2015, including revised Bylaws and a new Manual of Operations for de Cristo, a completely revised Gracious Dismissal Policy and a Sexual Misconduct Prevention Policy for each presbytery, and the creation of seven Administrative Commissions and training for the PJC in Grand Canyon.

Bob had summarized 40 overtures to the GA with regard to their relevance to our presbyteries. He also noted, with regret, the dismissal of two and dissolution of two Grand Canyon congregations. The annual computation to equalize the number of Teaching versus Ruling Elders for Presbytery commissioner assignment, distributed at registration, was approved. (See Pages 19-21.)

PRESBYTERY PASTOR REPORT

Brad Munroe reported that results from a congregational resourcing survey taken by both Grand Canyon and de Cristo had been reviewed and were becoming guiding factors for the leadership of both presbyteries.

Brad reminded presbyters that the Shared Staffing Plan was designed for a four-year trial period ending at the conclusion of 2017. He said the decision on whether to continue with a shared staff needed to be determined by both presbyteries by January 2017 so planning could take place, especially if the decision was to return to separate staffing for each presbytery.

Brad reported that both presbyteries were facing very serious budget deficits. Grand Canyon's projected 2016 deficit was \$180,000. This was due in large part to the loss of support from churches, including those planning departure from the denomination. While de Cristo's deficit was less at \$23,000, the Presbytery had only \$76,000 in reserves. Both presbyteries were facing serious budget cuts, and task forces had been started to review budgets in light of *Book of Order* requirements for a presbytery. The more difficult task was going to be the review of each presbytery's core commitments to eliminate spending in areas that, although not unimportant, could not be maintained simply because they had been budget line items in the past. Brad felt the leadership of each presbytery was being challenged to adopt a new adaptive skill set.

Brad was pleased to report that both de Cristo and Grand Canyon had each applied for a \$50,000 PC(USA) Transformation Grant. The funding was to be used for leadership training for both Teaching and Ruling Elders, guided by what presbyters had shared as their needs and desires for the future through feedback from the recent congregational resourcing surveys.
